## Ceramics 1

Fall 2019 1st Period

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#### Overview

This course will cover all of the basic construction, decoration and glazing techniques used in ceramics. **Emphasis will be placed on technique and mastery of the media as well as the basic vocabulary related to ceramics.**Students will also be responsible for care of the media and equipment within a studio environment. Slip casting and wheel throwing may be experimented with if students have finished all work and are in good standing in grades.

## Course Expectations

Students will use their knowledge of the media and specific techniques to solve a variety of "problems" in clay. Students will also respond to and analyze their work in a written format. Students will be responsible for all projects, quizzes, tests, a final exam and a final project. Homework assignments may be assigned as they relate to class projects.

## Requirements

Students will be responsible for all projects, quizzes, tests, a final exam and a final project. Homework assignments may be assigned as they relate to class projects. Students will photograph all pieces before they are fired and keep a folder on their google drive of these photographs. All photographs must be taken in the photobooth unless they are too large.

## **Evaluation**

Your paper, projects and critiques comprise 80% of your grade. Each assignment is based on 5 categories: 1. Completion of assignment, 2. Craftsmanship,

3. Progress, 4. Glaze, and 5. Inventiveness.

## **Materials**

Students may want to consider bringing in an oversized t-shirt and sweatpants to go over clothing to keep clean. You will also need to keep a sketchbook of your designs, which will be checked. If you draw in another book, rip it out and glue it in your sketchbook.

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### Attendance
